Remarks by President Roh Moo-hyun at a State Dinner for President Ali Abdullah Saleh of the Republic of Yemen

There are also great possibilities for cooperation in the information & communication and construction sectors. I hope that Korean businesses will make a contribution to Yemen's LNG project and high-speed communication network. The interest and support of Your Excellency

and the Yemeni Government would be appreciated.

The lessons that Yemen's national unification provides Korea, the only country in the world divided by Cold War rivalries, are considerable. I am aware that the speech Your Excellency delivered at Seoul National University today elicited considerable response from students. I ask you to provide unwavering support for Korea's policy of peace and prosperity.
